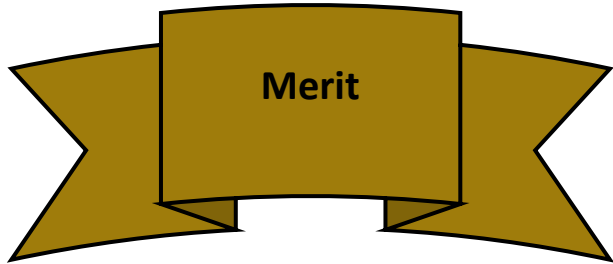
And I convince myself it's ok, my parents worked hard, that's why they're wealthy
